

Curriculum Vitae of Mr. Peter Matthews

Peter is a member of the American Academy of Actuaries, a Fellow of the Institute of Actuaries and has a first class degree in mathematics from Exeter University. He was one of the founding partners of EMB Consultancy, an actuarial firm specialising purely in the Property and Casualty insurance sector.

Peter has provided reserving advice to many Lloyd's syndicates and London Market companies and has represented a large US insolvency on the KWELM Reserving Committee. He has been the Scheme actuary for Chancellor, Stockholm Re (Bermuda), Scan Re, Mentor (UK) and Pacific and General.

Peter has peer reviewed the actuarial work performed on Fremont (UK), ICS (Re), RMCA (Re), UIC, Charter Re and Municipal General Insurance Company.
